Family Dog: Hot weather activities with your dog

Hot days can make entertaining your dog a challenge. He wants to play outside; you want to stay close to the A/C. Here are some good warmweather options:

Go when it's cooler. Take walks in the evening or in the early morning when temperatures are lower and the pavement is cool. Bring water and a collapsible water dish with you.

Make food interactive. Take a plastic container and fill it with half water, half low-sodium chicken broth. Throw in half your dog's kibble for the day, some carrots, and apple slices. Freeze the whole thing overnight.

The next day, shake the cube out of the container by running water over it until it loosens. Then

(Don't forget: always supervise dogand-child activities.)






Dog in the Spotlight: Yorkshire Terrier
